The University of Wyoming is a doctoral/research (\$100M in external funding this past year), Internet II, Division I-A, land-grant university with more than 13,000 students enrolled in baccalaureate, master's, and doctoral programs on and off campus. The only four-year, state university in Wyoming, UW is located in Laramie, a city of 27,000 nestled on the high plains between two ranges of the Rocky Mountains. The campus is a two-hour drive north of Denver, Colorado.
